Norfolk Island Orientation Tour

We cover most of the Island and learn what it was like in the first settlement, during penal times in Norfolk Island and the arrival of the Pitcairn Islanders, descendants of the famous Mutiny on the Bounty. Visit Kingston, Cascade, Anson Bay and the wonderful St Barnabas Chapel. After our morning tour, why not visit the **Cyclorama**, (own cost) a multi award winning Norfolk Island attraction. Cyclorama is an amazing 360 degree mural that vividly illustrates the journey of the Bounty aboard the HMS Bounty from England to Tahiti to Pitcairn Island and Norfolk Island. An experience not to be missed!

Pitcairn Settlers Village

Experience the proud heritage of the Pitcairn Island Settlers. Our guided tour will include the gracious original Bailey homestead and gardens including a stroll through the barn dairy and out buildings. Visit the museum filled with items of nostalgic and historic interest and see the oldest working forge in the South Pacific. Also included is a visit to an ex New Zealand Army hut with war – time memorabilia. Complimentary refreshments are included.

Bounty Day Re-enactment & Celebrations

This morning we will be picked up from reception to **join the Bounty Mutineer Descendants** as they re-enact the landing of their forefathers. The landing takes place at the Kingston Pier, the oldest pier in the Southern Hemisphere. Follow the procession of the Bounty Mutineer descendants, dressed in period costume, to the Cenotaph to pay respects to fallen heroes. Hymns will be sung at the Cenotaph memorial, then it's onto the cemetery where wreaths will be laid and local hymns will be sung along with the Pitcairn Anthem, (Norfolk Island's national anthem). The Bounty Mutineer descendants then make their way to the All Saints Church for the judging of the best dressed families, then observe the tradition of the children of the Bounty Mutineers descendants rolling down the Government House hill.

Following we make our way to the compound for a traditional Island picnic, prior to lunch the Norfolk grace will be sung. Sample some traditional Norfolk Wettles and enjoy complimentary wine (red & white) orange juice, tea or coffee. There will also be some local talent to keep us entertained.

Breakfast Bushwalk

Today we rise a little earlier to discover the incredible scenic beauty of Norfolk Island's natural environment on a relaxing, informative and guided one hour bush walk. Farm & Industry Tour including Mt Pitt (exclusive for Trade Travel passengers)

Whilst tourism is Norfolk's largest industry, it is by no means its only one. On this tour, we see a selection of the many other enterprises that sustain the community. These might include raising meat producing sheep, market gardening, manufacturing soft drinks and liqueurs. Our local guides also take us through the Bottlehouse before journeying to the top of Mt Pitt to enjoy the spectacular views around the Island.

Baunti Island Fish Fry

This evening we enjoy one of Norfolk Island's most famous dinners - the Island Fish Fry. We will have an eagle-eye view of the tiny crescent-shaped beach and the magnificent spread of ocean stretching to the far horizon. It's the most glamorous picnic we will ever attend! Scrumptious fresh, local fish is prepared the local way and accompanied with a range of seasonal island dishes including those passed down from Polynesian fore-mothers. This extends even to dessert. Our feast kicks off with entertainment with a local singer and Tahitian-style dancers. The Island Fish Feast is something that we will remember as a highlight of our Norfolk tour.

1856 The Untold Story

On 8 June 1856 a total of 194 people, descendants from the Bounty, arrived on Norfolk Island from Pitcairn Island aboard the Morayshire. This consisted of 40 men, 47 women, 54 boys and 53 girls. They arrived in cold, wet blustery conditions, few had ever been to sea before, they were seasick, homesick and heartsick. The journey of 6,000km /3,700 miles took five weeks. They arrived to a recently abandoned penal settlement set aside for the 'worst of the worst', it was full of ghosts, terrible stories and horrific memories. It was a large and frightening testimony of man's inhumanity to man. The 1856 untold story will follow their journey within the World Heritage Listed Kingston area. This tour will bring the past to life with an audio aboard our touring bus, recounting stories of the families, where they lived and how they adapted to their new life on Norfolk Island.
